

### Standby Mode and Display Shut Off:

## **Troubleshooting**

Q1: Nothing happens when a button is pressed.

A1: The HOLD switch may be set to [HOLD] position. The batteries may be depleted.

The batteries may be inserted incorrectly. Q2: No sound or quiet sound is heard from the speaker while playing back.

A2: The earphone plug may be plugged into the recorder. The volume may be set to the minimum level.

Q3: Recording is not possible. A3: By pressing the STOP (■) button repeatedly while the recorder stops, check if
